MH SLASHES FUEL SURCHARGES

MALAYSIA Airlines has slashed fuel surcharges on international flights by as much as 73%.

Effective today (January 30), the carrier will remove its fuel surcharge from Singapore and Brunei flights. There has also been a worldwide reduction of up to 54% in fuel surcharges to/from ASEAN countries.

In addition, effective February 1, fuel surcharges on flights from China will be reduced by up to US\$100, flights from Australia and New Zealand by up to US\$120 and flights from the Middle East will see a drop of up to US\$150.

Flights to Africa and North America will also see a reduction of up to US\$160 and US\$185.
